

# So, what's new in the world of technology this Month?

So what's new in the world of technology this month? A female robot takes to the catwalk in Japan. Google launched its new Street View service to some controversy, Apple trumpets the new arrival of its new baby iPod Shuffle, and following a SatNav can be dangerous! Oh and lastly, can you help me to help you? Please read on...

Female robot takes to the catwalk in Japan. Charmingly known as HRP-4C, this is the most lifelike robot to be developed yet, and can walk, move its arms and even talk through moving lips with some facial expression. See the news video at: http://news.bbc.co.uk/1/hi/world/7947189.stm (or just Google it!)

Google Street View is an add-on feature to the excellent Maps service. It enables the user to 'walk' down a street (just in a number of major cities at the moment) and view buildings on either side in very clear detail. The controversy arose over privacy and whether this could be used as a tool for burglars or others planning illegal activity in an area.

The images are not 'real time' of course; they were gathered over the past year by a specially adapted car with a 360' camera on its roof. One man walking in a London borough saw the car drive past him, and commented that after years of using Google to search for things, he realised he had just been 'Googled back!' To protect people's privacy however all faces and car number plates have been blurred out and if any householder objects to their house being shown they can request it be taken off.

Recently I was following a van with a camera on each corner, owned by the company that does satellite mapping for Google, along Eppleworth Road, so perhaps Cottingham is to be 'upgraded' soon! This area is already shown in great detail anyway on Google Maps. www.google.co.uk/maps

Apple's new baby is the tiny iPod Shuffle. Only about thumb sized, but considerable thinner, the tiny device can hold up to 1,000 songs and has an innovative control built into the earphone leads, and a computerised voice that tells you the track name! See website for details: www.apple.com/uk

A driver is facing a 'hefty recovery bill', and a possible charge of driving without due care and attention after following his BMW's SatNav to the edge of a West Yorkshire cliff. Even though the track was becoming narrower and steeper, he apparently trusted the device more than his own eyes, and ended up with the car precariously hanging over the edge, requiring a 9 hour rescue operation! www.guardian.co.uk

ESET has now launched a new version 4 of its best-selling antivirus and security products. Enhanced threat detection features are built in and even a feature that monitors if you have the latest Windows security updates installed on your PC, directing you to the update site if required. Two versions of the product are available and details can be found at www.eset.co.uk including with prices and even a free 30 day trial. We are pleased to have been resellers for ESET for nearly a year now and can supply licences by email or post, or by visit to install. Payment can be made by cheque or cash; useful for those who don't like to buy products online. Existing users who wish to upgrade to v4 can download it and install it over the top of the previous version, you will need your ESET username and password to do this.

Rogue or fake antivirus (aka malware) products are becoming more frequent now, and some of the new ones are managing to get past normal defences. Look out for anything with names like Antivirus 2009, XP or Vista Antivirus, and a devious program called FileFix which has to be purchased for \$50 to unscramble your own data after corruption. If anything like this appears on your screen advising you have so many infections or insecure areas, do not click to agree to any offers to download or install anything

Up to date programs on your computer are important, and a useful little utility to check this for you is available free (for personal use) from a company called Secunia. Once downloaded and installed it will offer to scan your PC's programs and advise if an update is available. If so, all you have to do is click on the button and it will locate and install it for you! See website: http://secunia.com/vulnerability\_scanning/personal/

Lastly the help me to help you topic! 'Does this come with an instruction manual?' A question I am often asked, and often the answer is sadly 'No'. Manufacturers for a few years now have reduced costs and paper usage by not producing printed manuals, putting the content on CD instead. Having written articles such as these for many years I am planning to put together a book full of helpful hints and tips, in Plain English of course! Many people have told me in the past that they have bought a computer book but found it didn't tell them what they needed to know. So I would very much like to hear from readers what you would like to see in such a book. ## **Revival of Garden Competition**

It is hoped that upgrades to the recording and signalling systems can be made in the forthcoming financial year to improve image quality and ease of access to recordings and the tender process to appoint a contractor for maintenance of the system has begun.

# **Cottingham Cricket Club have** been busy during winter training

s the season starts in earnest for the club at the end of April, its members have been busy during the winter training at St Mary's College at their indoor nets.

Twelve lads have been on the East Yorkshire Coaches Association Development Programme on a Saturday morning at St Mary's College in Hull with 3 others on the Yorkshire Cricket Board Pathways Scheme again at St Mary's. Will Rhodes, who has been training at Headingley on the Pathways Scheme since November, has been pre-selected to represent Yorkshire at U14 level. On a Saturday morning at Cottingham High School the club has provided coaching and games for up to 20 further boys and girls who are



### **Ingredient of the month - Ice Cream**

Thilst there are all sorts of spectacular stories about the origins of ice cream including Marco Polo bringing it to Europe from China or Catherine de' Medici introducing it to France there doesn't seem to be any real evidence to substantiate any of these theories.

It is true that various ancient civilisations used ice in desserts and that the Ancient Persians even had the equivalent of giant "refrigerators" known as yakhchals which were naturally cooled structures used to store ice through the summer which had been gathered in the winter from nearby mountains but what these peoples ate were more akin to ices rather than ice cream.

### **Predecessors to Ice Cream**

Evidence of the predecessors of today's ice cream being made was in China during the Tang period(618-907 A.D.), when milk was heated and allowed to ferment to something similar to 'yoghurt' which was then mixed with flour and camphor and chilled before being served. However, the first technical description of ice making using various salts which were mixed with ice, to get low enough temperatures to freeze liquids in a container, was by an Arab medical historian Ibn Abu Usaybi c1230-1270 A.D.

The process didn't reach Europe until 1503. In Italy where it was initially considered more of a magician's trick and the results were not used for edible food until the 1660s when sorbets were eaten in Naples, Florence, Paris and Spain.

### The First "Iced Cream"

The first ice cream made with milk didn't appear until 1664 in Naples and in the UK, ice cream was served at a banquet at Windsor Castle in 1671 however it was such a rarity, that only the guests on King Charles II's table got to sample it. It was after this time that wealthy people wishing to emulate their king, built ice houses on their estates, when ice which was gathered in winter from lakes, ponds and rivers which was stored under straw and bark, until the summer when it was used to make 'iced creams' using the salt freezing method so the dubious ice was never actually eaten. The first recipe in English did not appear until 1718.

The making of custard based ice cream using egg yolks appeared in France in the middle of the 1700s and this is the origin of custard based ice cream and was introduced to America in the early 1800s.

### 19th Century Ice Cream

Ice cream became readily available to the masses in the UK in the early part of the 1800s due to the importation of ice from Norway, Canada and the US in the early 19th century.

The ice cream machine was introduced in 1843 in both England and America. This new contraption consisted of a wooden bucket filled with ice and salt, a handle which rotated and a central container which would be surrounded by the ice mixture and which would contain the ice cream mixture. The churning action produced ice cream which had a smooth texture.

Italy continued to be the European leaders in ice cream making and Italian immigrants to the UK brought their expertise, setting up businesses selling ice cream often wrapped in waxed paper and known to the English as Hokey pokey - a play on the Italian phrase 'ecco un poco' meaning 'here is a little'.

At the end of the 19th Century, mechanical refrigeration utilising gas or electricity took the ice cream industry to new heights as it became possible to transport and store ice cream.

### 20th Century Ice Cream

The second half of the 20th century saw the popularity of ice cream proliferate worldwide mainly due to cheaper refrigeration. Not only were there more outlets selling it, but there was also an explosion of flavours and types.

Another 20th century development was the introduction of soft ice cream. A team of chemical researchers in Britain discovered a method of doubling the amount of air in ice cream, enabling manufacturers to use less ingredients which reduced their costs. The airy lighter texture of soft ice cream was a hit with consumers in particular when it was "piped" into a cone directly from soft ice cream machines.



However, as with many new ideas, in the 1980s, old-style thicker ice creams made a come-back, taking the market by storm.

### Mango Evaporated Milk Ice Cream

Ingredients

250g/9oz Mango Flesh, chopped (or fruit of your choice)

The Juice of half a Lemon

1 x 175g/6oz tin Evaporated Milk, chilled overnight

50g/2oz Icing Sugar

### Instructions

- Place the mango and lemon juice in a food processor or blender and process to a puree. Set aside.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, beat the chilled evaporated milk until thick.
- 3. Stir in the mango mixture and sugar and blend thoroughly.
- 4. Transfer to an ice cream maker and churn for 20 minutes or according to the manufacturers instructions. Alternatively, place the mixture in a rigid freezer proof box and freeze until just beginning to set around the edges. Remove from the freezer and beat well with a fork then return to the freezer until firm (3-5 hours).

### **Chocolate Bread and Butter Pudding**

Ingredients:

6 slices well buttered Bread

50g/2oz Sultanas

4 Eggs

1 teasp Vanilla Extract

25g/1oz Sugar

600ml/20fl.oz. Milk

200g/7oz Dark chocolate, roughly chopped

A little extra Sugar

### Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 170C, 325F, Gas mark 3. Grease a 7.5cm/3 inch deep ovenproof dish.
- Remove the crusts from the buttered bread and cut into quarters (triangles or squares). Reserve 4 quarters for the top and arrange the rest in layers in the dish, sprinkling the sultanas between each layer. Top with the reserved quarters
- Place the milk and chocolate in a saucepan and heat to hot but not boiling and stir well until the chocolate has melted.
- In a large bowl, mix together the eggs, vanilla and sugar then add the hot milk, stirring well.
- 5. Slowly strain over the bread and fruit, being careful not to dislodge the top layer of bread. Leave to stand for 10 minutes.
- 6. Sprinkle with a little sugar and bake in the oven for 30-40 minutes until the top is browned and crispy.



## A Bunny is not just for Easter

aster is almost here now and as well as lots of Easter eggs, chocolate Easter Rabbits are also given to children. Rabbits were always thought of as the original first children's pets along with other small mammals such as hamsters but do we know how much care rabbits really need! I don't think many of us do, so here is a quick guide to help before

I certainly didn't know how much care was involved until I took two stray rabbits home from work, but rabbits are such characters that they make great pets.

#### Housing

If your rabbit is living outside then they need a waterproof hutch, usually raised off the ground, large enough to allow the rabbit room to rise up on its hind legs and stitch out to perform at least three hops. There needs to be a separate sleeping area and the hutch need to be placed out direct sunlight and draughts. I use straw and hay as bedding. Rabbits need to have access to run daily for exercise.

It is essential that the toileting area is cleaned out every day and the whole hutch once a week.

### **Feeding**

Most health problems in rabbits arise from their diets in the fact that rabbits require a high fibre diet and one that also take a lot of chewing to wear their teeth down. In reality this means a staple diet of hay or grass with some small amounts of supplementary food, ideally an all in one pellet. Do not use the mixed cereal diets as the rabbit will selectively eat the cereal parts leading to obesity and tooth problems as it feels full very quickly and will not eat much hay. Fresh vegetables should be a daily requirement, cauliflower leaves, apples, carrots etc but no lettuce. Fresh water should be available at all times.

### HEALTH PROBLEMS Myxomatosis

This dreadful and nearly always fatal disease causes puffy swellings of the face, eyes and genitals, breathing problems and severe depression. Myxomatosis is spread by fleas or biting flies so you rabbit does not even have to come into contact with other rabbits. The good news is that there is a vaccination available that needs to be given every 6 months.


Rabbit with Myxomatosis



### Teeth

As already discussed rabbits teeth grow continually and need constant use to wear them down. Rabbits suffering from weight loss, lack of appetite or salivating around the chin may have teeth problems, so take them to your veterinary surgeon, where with special equipment the inside of the mouth may be examined. If the rabbit has long teeth or spurs cutting into the tongue these can be trimmed under general anaesthetic.

Viral Haemorrhagic Disease

This fatal viral infection causes breathing problems, diarrhoea although most often the rabbit is just found dead in the hutch. Annual vaccination will prevent it.

### Fly Strike

Every day you need to check your rabbit's bottom as a build up of faecal matter will encourage flies to lay their eggs and maggots develop which will eat away the flesh around the anus. In rabbits which have greater risk of faecal impaction there is a solution available from your veterinary surgeon that will stop the fly's eggs hatching.





Start at GR. 116474 Street parking near Dacre Arms.



eave the street parking area near the Dacre Arms and walk in a northerly direction turning left at the road signed North Frodingham and Wansford. Pass Brandesburton Hall, which is now the entrance to a housing estate, on your right and locate and pass through a kissing gate on your left into the Golf Course. Walk across the Golf Course in a southerly direction and exit at some wooden steps onto Hempholme Lane.

Cross this lane and walk along the A165 towards Beverley. After about 350 metres turn right into Heigholme Lane, this lane eventually becomes a green lane and then a path along a field boundary. At the end of the field turn left and then immediately right and cross over a footbridge over a drain. After crossing the footbridge, turn right and after about 200 metres turn left and walk with the field hedge on your right climbing very gently. After a short distance you then begin to descend very gently to meet a hedge. Pass through the hedge and continue walking in the same direction to meet a surfaced lane. On reaching the lane, turn right and follow this lane as it passes The Coach House of Heigholme Farm on the left and twists its way towards Burshill.


After about 0.5 miles and about 100 metres past a single Hawthorn bush, locate a way marker and turn right following the path to meet a hedge after about 200 metres. Turn left at this point and walk towards Burshill with the hedge on your left. Pass through a metal gate and pass numerous farm buildings on the left to emerge onto the road. Turn right on reaching the road and walk through the hamlet of Burshill to reach a road junction. Turn left at this junction sign posted for Hempholme.

After about 400 metres turn right and walk along the track. This track swings to the right and then left and passes Westfield Farm and then again swings right and left and passes the grounds of the old hospital. On reaching Frodingham road turn right and follow the road back to the start.





# In the Garden



## Vegetable Garden

hit and plant out second early potatoes in the first half of the month and maincrop potatoes in the second half. Potatoes can be planted in deep drills or in individual planting holes, with 5cm of soil mounded over the top. Alternatively, plant them through slits in black polythene mulch.

Sow beetroot, carrots, Swiss chard, summer cauliflower, kohl rabi, lettuce, leeks, radish, turnip, spring and pickling onions, peas and perpetual spinach in well-prepared soil.

Plant shallots, garlic and onion sets.

Plant Jerusalem artichoke tubers.

Plant asparagus crowns. A deep, friable, well-drained soil with plenty of organic matter incorporated is ideal.

Broad beans grown in pots can now be transplanted into the garden.

In the second half of the month (wait until early May in cold areas) you can sow marrows, courgettes, pumpkins and squash in a heated glasshouse at a germination temperature of 16°C (61°F).

In very mild areas you may be able to sow dwarf French beans and sweet corn outside under cloches or fleece, but in cooler areas it is best to wait until May.

Sow a seedbed of brassicas to provide transplants of sprouting broccoli, cauliflowers and cabbages that will be ready for planting out to their final position in June or July, and for harvesting in autumn/winter. It is rather late for sowing Brussels sprouts, but

you can still buy young plants from the garden centre.

Sweet peppers, tomatoes, cucumbers, aubergines, celery, salads and globe artichokes can all be sown in a frost-free greenhouse. Artichokes and celery can be transplanted outside later in the spring. Tomatoes germinate best at 22°C (72°F), and can either remain in the greenhouse or go outside from early summer onwards. Peppers, cucumbers and aubergines do best kept under cover throughout their life.

Pot up tomato seedlings when they develop true leaves above the more rounded seed leaves. After growing on in small pots, they can be planted into larger pots or growing-bags.

Plant out onions sown from seed earlier in the spring. Don't use ground used for onions in the last three years.

Pea plants should be supported with sticks, twigs, green support mesh, or wire netting from the garden centre.

Thin out rows of seedlings as soon as they are large enough to be handled.

Fleece and polythene can be used to protect early outdoor sowings. Many vegetables can bolt if sown outside too early without protection (beetroot being an example). A greenhouse or conservatory is useful in all but the very mildest areas with the lightest soils, to start seeds off, hardening off and transplanting the young plants into the vegetable garden later in the spring.

You could prepare your runner bean supports and trenches for sowing (in May) or planting out (in June). This will save you time later.



# Alternative Health Matters

by Carole Headley

ast month I wrote about vitamins and minerals and so I thought I would continue with the mineral information this month. I sincerely hope you, the reader, have found the information useful or informative. Don't forget to consult your GP or a registered Dietician. Also be aware that the NES programme can identify an imbalance of your vitamins and minerals.

COPPER - helps promote a healthy liver, brain and muscle function and essential but only in small amounts. It has been suggested that an intake of 0.8mg to 3mg is safe. There is no recommended daily intake available at this time. Copper plays an important role in cellular inspiration and the synthesis of collagen, therefore helps maintain healthy bones, cartilage, hair and skin (especially their elasticity) Good sources include shell fish, oysters, olives, nuts, pulses, wholegrain cereals, green vegetables (especially grown in copper-rich soil) Processing can reduce mineral content of foods by up to 80% and freezing or cooking can further be lost. A deficiency can occur with some conditions of Chrohn's or ceoliac disease.

IODINE - (is a trace element) and is essential for the production of hormones, thyroxine and tri-iodotyhyronine, which control the metabolic rate, the conversion of food and fat stores into energy and the production of body heat, Iodine helps prevent lack of energy, tiredness and excessive weight gain. Good food sources are marine fish, seaweed, iodised salt, milk (cattle feed is also iodised), crops and cattle reared on soils exposed to sea spray. (Not sure how you would find out that information!!) The EC RDA for iodine is 150mcg per day. A deficiency in iodine leads to swelling of the thyroid gland (goitre) - this is quite rare in UK. Athletes should take a supplement as iodine is depleted through sweat Selenium also plays a role in the metabolism of thyroid hormones and the effects of iodine deficiency are made worse by low selenium intakes.

*IRON* - a metallic mineral - this is needed for the production of red blood cell pigmentation, haemoglobin (which transports oxygen and carbon dioxide around the body) and the red muscle pigment, myoglobin (which binds oxygen in muscle cells for ready access during exercise). Good sources are: red meat, offal, shellfish, fish, especially sardines, wheat germ, wholemeal bread, egg yolk, green vegetables and prunes and other dried fruits.

**MAGNESIUM** - an essential mineral, seventy per cent of body stores are found in the bones and teeth. It is important in controlling calcium entry into heart cells to trigger a regular heart beat. Magnesium is vital for every major metabolic reaction from the synthesis of protein and genetic material to the production of energy from glucose. Few enzymes can work without it. Good food sources are seafood, seaweed, meat, eggs, dairy products, wholegrain, soya beans, nuts, bananas, dark green leafy vegetables and chocolate. Physically active people should consider taking more magnesium as large amounts can be lost through sweat. Magnesium regulates the movement of calcium in and out of cells, it is important for bone health and preventing osteoporosis.

Again I hope you have found this useful and would stipulate that you consult your GP before taking any of these products especially if you are on medication.
