

# Alternative Health Matters by Carole Headley

## Aromatherapy Massage

romatherapy is an age old tradition in which the therapist uses her/his knowledge and understanding of oils and their properties to help clients achieve a sense of well-being.

Did you know that the use of aromatic oils on the body dates back at least 2000 years before Jesus. There are records in the Bible of the use of plants and their oils. It is known that the ancient Chinese and Egyptians used oils to enhance massage and well-being. Then came the Greeks and Romans. The earliest known use of oils in England was in the Thirteenth century. Glove makers used essential oils to perfume their gloves and it was a known fact that in the Middle Ages the perfumers never succumbed to illness. Nowadays we do not hear of essential oils being used for perfuming products. The first use of oil for its natural healing properties was a chemist called Gattefosse, who found after burning his hands in his lab found that lavender was a wondrous healer of burns and used during the first wold war lavender oil accelerated the healing process.

Aromatherapy by a qualified person will bring about an improved sense of well being; regular treatments will improve skin and general health. This type of massage has a wide variety of different effects for different people; it depends on what you are being treated for as to what effects you will see. Through the help of the oils the clients can feel emotional changes, physical changes and physiological changes; each client has a different sensation during and after treatment. The oils can release tension and stress, relax emotional burden, freedom from aches and pains, give a feeling of total relaxation and with the help of the massage help to rejuvenate the emotional being as well as the physical one.

Every treatment is for the individual and can treat a range of different things, so each client will have a new mix of oils. Normally in a consistency of a top note, which can penetrate the skin in 4-8 hours, a middle note which can penetrate the skin in 8-12 hours and the base note can take anything up to 24 hours after having the massage. It is important to note that after an aromatherapy massage you should not, if you can avoid it, have a shower or bath for at least 4 hours if not longer to ensure that the essential oils have been fully absorbed: the most beneficial would be to leave the oils on for a maximum of 24 hours for the full effect to be obtained.

In aromatherapy massage there are two types of oil that can be used, essential oils and base oils, because essential oils are volatile (this means they evaporate quickly) they have to be mixed into base oil so that it enables the therapist to spread them into the skin. Base oil is normally vegetable or mineral oil. Essential oils can be oil that is normally obtained from roots of plants, wood, leaves, fruits, seeds and flowers. Most essential oils have effects, they will sedate or uplift, relax or stimulate; the result achieved will depend entirely on the client being treated. Each essential oil has its own properties and a mixture of one or more oils can be used to aid different problems.

Aromatherapy usually takes one hour fifteen minutes as long as there are no contraindications and upon consultation you will receive aftercare advice following your treatment. I would recommend you come in loose comfortable clothing. The general recommendation is to have one treatment every week for 4-6 weeks then one every two weeks thereafter. However this decision is entirely left to the client.



## Scouts and Guides join hands to save old school for Cottingham

niformed members of Cottingham's 250-strong Scout and Guide movements linked hands to form a ring around part of the village's oldest school to send an important message to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council: SOS! - 'Save Our School'

Hallgate Junior School, built in Victorian times with later additions, is due to close in July this year, with a new combined Primary opening on the neighbouring Infants' School site in September.

East Riding Council currently have no plans for the old buildings, and there are fears they may be boarded up or eventually sold to the private sector, but Cottingham groups, including the Scouts and Guides, and Hallgate Old School Preservation Association (HOSPA) want it to remain in service as a community centre for the village's residents and organisations, representing a broad cross-section of ages and interests.

Since the former Scout HQ, used by the Guides and other community groups for many years, was demolished by the council in 2007 to make way for the new school, the groups have had no permanent home for their meetings or space for their camping gear and other kit. Worse, because the council owned the land on which the HQ stood, they ruled that the Scouts were owed no compensation, despite considerable financial investment in the building over many years. As if that wasn't enough, the Scouts lost much of their camping gear in the June 2007 floods after it was moved to temporary storage in a garage basement.

With around £450,000 required to build a replacement, the Scouts and Guides have therefore joined forces with HOSPA in more costeffective and sustainable plans to convert the two old school buildings into a community centre. The smaller building, constructed in 1913, would be altered to comprise two halls, a kitchen/clubroom, meeting rooms, and ample storage space for use as a new Scout/Guide HQ and youth centre, while the older, larger block would include a mixture of meeting rooms for adult groups and small business units, eventually set in landscaped gardens.

## In the Garden





#### Fruit and vegetable garden

Cut back sideshoots on gooseberries to four or five leaves, or just beyond the fruit clusters. This will speed ripening (by increasing sun on the fruits), encourage fruit bud formation for next year, and control aphids on the new growth. Red and white currants may be pruned in the same way.

When summer-fruiting raspberries have finished cropping promptly cut out the old canes.

Fruit picking can begin in earnest, with strawberries, cherries, summer-fruiting raspberries, currants and the earliest of the plums. Remember to harvest red, and white, currants in bunches, still on the stalk - they will keep and taste better. Blackcurrants can be picked singly or in clusters, as preferred.

Continue to tie in and train new blackberry canes. Keep new canes separate from older, fruiting canes to ease later pruning.

Continue to peg down strawberry runners if new plants are needed. This will encourage the plantlets to root.

Propagate blackberries and other cane fruits with long, lax stems by tip layering.

Thinking of growing blueberries? If so, check your soil pH is sufficiently acidic - blueberries need a pH of 5.5-5 to prosper. Otherwise grow in containers of ericaceous compost.

## Vegetables

There's lots to harvest in the vegetable patch, including spinach, peas, beets, carrots, salads, potatoes and globe artichokes; shallots and spring-planted garlic may be ready as well.

Pick courgettes before they become marrows. Overwintered onions can be lifted and used. Plant out leeks and brassicas for a winter supply, if not yet done. Sow spring cabbage, turnips, Oriental vegetables, chicory, fennel, and autumn/winter salads such as lamb's lettuce.

Carrots can still be sown, but beware carrot fly when thinning existing seedlings Climbing beans may need stopping, to maximise cropping on existing sideshoots. Stop them when they reach the tops of their supports. Summer cauliflowers may need shading to prevent the curds scorching in bright sun. Don't forget to stop cordon tomatoes by removing the main shoot. Look for the leaf that's above the fourth truss and cut it off here. This should ensure that all the fruits ripen by the end of the season. Bush tomatoes can be left to their own devices.

#### Flower garden

Cut back delphiniums and geraniums after the first flush of flowers to encourage a second flowering period. Feed after cutting them back.

Deadhead flower borders regularly to prolong flowering. Disbud and dead-head dahlias if growing for large blooms. Leave roses that produce attractive hips

Autumn-flowering bulbs, such as autumn crocuses, Colchicum, Sternbergia, Amaryllis and Nerine, can be planted now. Prop up tall perennials such as lupins, delphiniums and gladioli if staking was neglected earlier in the season.


Pinks and carnations that have become leggy, can be propagated by layering or by cuttings. Propagation can improve the appearance of untidy clumps.

Start collecting seed from plants you want to grow next year, especially annuals such as Calendula, poppy and love-in-a-mist. Perennials and biennials can also be grown from seed, but will take a year to bloom. Some seeds are best planted just after collection, and others may need specific climatic conditions to break dormancy (e.g. some alpines). If unsure, then sow seeds in 'batches', i.e. one immediately after collecting, one in winter, and one in the following spring.

## Top 10 jobs

- 1. Check clematis for signs of clematis wilt
- 2. Place conservatory plants outside now that it is warm
- 3. Water tubs and new plants if dry, but be water-wise
- 4. Deadhead bedding plants and repeat-flowering perennials, to ensure continuous flowering
- 5. Pick courgettes before they become marrows
- 6. Treat apple scab
- 7. Clear algae, blanket weeds and debris from ponds, and keep them topped up
- 8. Order catalogues for next year's spring-flowering bulbs
- 9. Give the lawn a quick-acting summer feed, especially if a spring feed was not done
- 10. Give woodwork a lick of paint or preserver, while the weather is dry.








Here is Paul's fifth walk in his monthly column. This month his destination is Sledmere.

Maps:- EXPLORER 300

Start at GR. 928646 Near Sledmere Eleanor Cross and The Wolds

Waggoners Memorial. Distance 6.5 Miles.



eave the car park and walk towards Sledmere for about 100 metres and then turn left along the Kirby Grindalythe road. Follow this road for about 1.5 miles and then locate a farm lane on the right leading to Squirrel Hall Farm. Pass Squirrel Hall Farm on the left and continue in the same direction with a plantation on the left.

About 500 metres past the farm, turn left and pass through the plantation, pass through the hedge and turn right and now walk with the plantation on the right. At the junction of paths, turn right. Shortly pass the Trig Point (157 Metres) and then continue with Thirkleby Wold Plantation on the right. Continue on the farm track to meet the road to East and West Lutton (Known as Croome Road). Turn right and follow the road for about 700 metres. Just after passing the farm road leading to Croome Farm on the right, turn left and pass through a kissing gate and walk across the centre of the field heading for a large tree. Pass through a kissing gate and turn right along a chalk track.

Pass through a kissing gate on the left near farm buildings and walk with the field boundary on the right. On approaching Long Wood, pass through a kissing gate and then walk with the wood on the left and follow this round to the Recreation field to emerge on the Bridlington Road. Turn right and then at the "T" junction turn right and walk back through the village to the car park.



## Ingredient of the Month

### Gelatine

elatine (also spelt Gelatin) is used mainly as a thickening or emulsifying agent for culinary uses. It is a pure protein which contains no fat, carbohydrates or cholesterol and is free of all preservatives. It is best known as the setting agent for jellies, but many dishes that need to be moulded and/or turned out, such as bavarois, cold mousses or uncooked cheesecakes make use of its properties.

#### **Origin and History**

The exact time of the discovery of gelatin is not known, but considering it is derived after the boiling of animal skin and bone, it is quite likely to have been quite some time ago. Whenever it was, it is certain that chefs utilised its wonderful setting properties to create gastronomic works of art, which were both pleasing to the eye and tempting on the palate.

In England during the Victorian era (late 1800's to early 1900s) Gelatine was widely used in both savoury and sweet dishes. Cooks were renowned for using fancy moulds in all shapes and sizes, from tall and fluted to long and low and even some in the shape of fish and other animals.

Commercially produced gelatine appears to have started in Holland around 1685, shortly followed by England in about 1700. The first commercial production of gelatine in the United States was in Massachusetts in 1808.

#### **Cultivation and Processing**

Gelatine does not occur "free" in nature. It has to be made or manufactured. However, it is a natural ingredient, in that it derived from natural ingredients and has no additives. Nowadays, it is made mainly from beef bones and hides and pork skin, which contain protein collagen, the essential ingredient required for the production of gelatine.

It is a lengthy process in which extraneous substances, such as minerals, fats and albuminoids are removed by chemical and physical treatment to give a purified collagen. It involves several cleansing and purification steps and is finally dried in an air chamber, then processed into the end product (sheets, granules, powder).

#### Gelatine in Cooking

Gelatine is available in sheets (leaf), powder or granules and in clear sheets or leaves. Generally speaking, 6 sheets of gelatine is the equivalent of 3 teaspoons of powdered gelatine (a 10g sachet). This is enough to soft-set 480ml/16fl.oz. of liquid.

To dissolve powdered gelatine, sprinkle it into a small bowl or cup containing 3 tablespoons of warm water, stirring constantly, then place the bowl into a container of boiling water and stir constantly until completely dissolved and transparent. NEVER boil the gelatine mixture.

To prepare leaf gelatine, soak it in cold water for 4-5 minutes, allowing it to swell. Remove the swollen leaf gelatine from the water and gently squeeze it out. When using in warm dishes add the squeezed out gelatine directly into the warm liquid and stir until it has completely dissolved. NEVER add gelatine to boiling liquids as this impairs its setting qualities.

When using in cold dishes place the squeezed gelatine in a saucepan over a very low heat together with a few tablespoons of the cold mixture into the dissolved gelatine mix very well. Remove from the heat



then add the rest of the cold mixture and mix thoroughly. NEVER add the gelatine to the mixture....always add the cold mixture to pan of gelatine. You can dissolve it in a microwave. Just place the squeezed out gelatine in a little bowl and melt it on high power for about 10 seconds. Then continue to prepare your dishes as if you were dissolving gelatine in cold dishes.

#### Raised Game Pie

Ingredients

675g/1filb Game Meat (Pork or chicken can be used instead of game), (Pheasant, Partridge, Hare or Rabbit)

225g/8oz Sausage Meat

300g/11oz Hot-Water Crust Pastry

100g/4oz Streaky Bacon

100g/4oz Mushrooms

Salt and Pepper

2 teasp Freshly chopped Marjoram

2 Teasp Freshly chopped Sage

2 tbsp Freshly chopped Thyme Leaves

1 Egg

300ml/10fl.oz. Aspic or Gelatine

NB: You can marinate the game meat with the herbs and some port for 4-8 hours before starting the recipe.

#### Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 200C, 400F, Gas Mark 6 and roll out 2/3rds of the pastry on a floured surface and use to line a greased pie mould.
- 2. Place a layer of bacon at the base of the mould then cover with a layer of half the sausage meat, then a layer of game, the remaining sausage meat and finally the mushrooms, seasoning well with the herbs, salt and pepper between each layer.
- 3. On a lightly floured surface, roll out the remaining pastry just large enough to make a lid and cover the pie. Press the edges together to seal and trim off any excess pastry, reserving the trimmings for decorations.
- 4. Decorate with the pastry trimmings, brush with beaten egg to glaze and cut a hole (about 12mm/1/2 inch in diameter in the centre to allow steam to escape. Bake for 30 minutes then reduce the heat to 150C, 300F, Gas Mark 2 and bake for a further 11/2 hours.
- 5. Remove the pie from the oven and allow to cool.
- 6. Heat the aspic in a saucepan over a low heat until just melted then pour into the cooled pie through the steam vent using a funnel. Chill for 6-8 hours before serving.





# Cottingham Parish Council

## **Local Police Report**

PC Morley attended the meeting to inform Councillors of the situation in Cottingham. He was pleased to report that the local policing team was up to full strength. PC Neil Chambers was now in post with the responsibility for Cottingham North; PC Morley was responsible for Cottingham South although their duties crossed over as and when necessary. The bicycles donated by the Parish Council are in use and he thanked the Council for their generosity.



PC Morley reported that a burglar who had been responsible for a spate of robberies over March/April had been jailed. There had been problems in March/April with gangs of youths from Orchard Park abusing staff in some of the bigger stores and shoplifting. One of the ringleaders was identified and threatened with an ASBO which appears to have stopped the trouble. Criminal damage figures had increased by 150% through March and April with another gang of youths coming into the village. Again some of the culprits had been identified and threatened with ASBO's and the trouble seems to have stopped with the criminal damage figures going back to a normal level for this area.

There had been some complaints from residents of Park Lane about drivers racing their cars up and down Park Lane. The police had stopped and warned the drivers about their behaviour and Section 59 letters had been sent out. ie if the drivers are involved in such behaviour again their cars would be confiscated. Cllr Hardwick thanked the police on behalf of the residents on Park Lane.

Cllr Leatham asked if the police were aware of the beggar outside Somerfields; PC Morley was aware and would monitor his behaviour.

## Report from Planning Committee

Erection of a single garage at the side of a house in Eppleworth Road, Cottingham. The deadline for replying to ERYC had passed and that a Notice of Decision had been received in respect of this application and the East Riding Council Planning Committee had approved this application

A change of use from a retail shop and cafe to form a cafe, erection of a single storey extension to side and installation of a new shop front at 145-147 Hallgate for Coopland & Son Ltd. The plans had been discussed were unchanged. The Council supported the application.

Cllr Hardwick commented on the correspondence between Red Roofs Nursery, ERYC and Swifts.

Swifts have agreed to pay for alterations to the junction on Northmoor Lane.

## **Report from Allotments Committee**

Cllr Hardwick reported on the Allotments Committee Meeting which had taken place on Tuesday 10th June. He stated that the allotments were in a good state and any problems there may be were being dealt with.

## Impact of Revised 2008/09

## Tax Allowance by Nic

Ithough the changes in income tax rates (abolishing the 10% rate and reducing the basic rate from 22% to 20%) were announced in March 2007, most people took very little notice at that time. When the new rates took effect in April 2008 there was an almighty fuss. Due to the loss of the 10% band those on lower wages began to pay more tax, and as the basic rate had been cut to 20% those with taxable incomes between about £18,000 and £35,000 had lower tax deductions.

After much dithering the Chancellor proposed a crude solution, which will not fully reimburse those on the lowest incomes who have lost out. The personal allowance for 2008/09 has been increased by £600 to £6,035 and the higher rate tax threshold has been reduced by £1,200. These changes are effective for the current tax year that started on 6 April 2008, and should result in a tax reduction of about £120 for basic rate taxpayers for 2008/09.

#### There are four main effects to consider...

- 1. If you run a payroll you are not expected to implement these changes until at least September 2008. HMRC have said they will issue instructions in the next few weeks on how the higher allowance and lower 40% threshold should be handled for PAYE purposes. The most straightforward solution would be to reissue all 22 million PAYE code numbers for 2008/09, but that would be very expensive for HMRC. We will let you know as soon as HMRC have decided what to do.
- **2.** If you are self-employed you will not feel the full effect of the tax reduction until 31 January 2010, when you pay your final tax bill for 2008/09. You may be able to reduce your tax installment payments due on 31 July 2008 and 31 January 2009, but that will be risky unless you know the level of profits that will be taxed for that year. We will only

be able to work this out accurately once your accounting year finishes and your accounts are finalised.

- **3. As a shareholder/director** you may be used to drawing a salary exactly equal to your personal allowance, which is now £503 per month. However, if you increase your current salary above £453 per month you will pay more NICs as the earnings threshold, where NICs become payable at 11%, has not moved up with the personal allowance.
- **4. If your total income exceeds** £41,435, you will see no difference in the tax you pay in 2008/09, but if you try to keep your income within the basic rate band you need to revise your calculations. As the higher rate tax threshold is now £34,800 not £36,000, you will need to restrict your dividend income to stay within that lower limit. Alternatively you could increase the pension contributions you pay by £480 (net).

#### **July Question**

- Q. We pay our employees a mileage allowance for business journeys in line with the Taxman's recommended rates. Can we reclaim any VAT in respect of those payments?
- A. You can reclaim the VAT but only on the proportion of the mileage allowance that relates to fuel. The mileage rate of 40p per mile has a large element of reimbursement for the vehicle's other running costs. You need to use as a reference point the HMRC advisory fuel only rates which vary according to the size of the car, and are reissued several times a year. For example, if the vehicle has a 1500cc petrol engine and you reimburse the driver for 1000 miles, the value of the fuel used is 13p per mile: £130. The VAT element is  $7/47 \times £130 = £19.36$ . However, the employee must supply you with fuel receipts totalling at least £130 to allow you to reclaim the VAT shown on those receipts.


